- We are Thomas. We question, doubt, resist, and fold our arms while uttering the challenge: SHOW ME! In the meantime, our Lord calls us to take up the cross and minister in His Name. But we can't and we won't, because we can't carry a cross when our arms are folded tightly to our sides.
- Who are we? We are all of these. But we are more. We are the objects of God's concern and love. We are the people for whom Jesus Christ died. We are the people to whom Jesus beckons, calling us to die to self and be raised to the new life of the resurrection. Just as surely as Jesus died and rose again, we are forgiven. As a called and ordained servant of Christ, and by His authority, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the
